First competition for short fiction about the Human Rights

The Organization "France fraternités" and the EMC Cinema School are putting together the first competition for short fiction about the Human Rights.

The UDHR has been written 70 years ago. Nevertheless, the values it carries are as vivid and modern as ever. Still today, the 30 articles of the UDHR represent as many scenarios possible. This competition has the ambition to bring the 18/25-year-old generation to introduce those articles in a contemporary story.

Fictions, cartoons, poetic or documentary essays; all films submitted must have a maximum duration of 4 minutes and have to be produced between January 2019 and November 2019.

This European competition is open to all major European schools and higher education institutions.

Schools, Establishments and Institutions can apply.

Students can also apply individually.

**FILMS PRESENTATION** and Awards Ceremony will be held by a Jury bringing together major humanitarian actors, and audiovisual professionals.

This Awards Ceremony will be a very special evening event. It will take place late March 2020.
